



These titles of the coming Christ appeared in daily Vesper antiphons sung during the week before Christmas; their roots date at least to the reign of Charlemagne. Both text and tune are the fruit of 19th-century efforts to reclaim Christian treasures from pre-Reformation sources.



We are an open and affirming community of faith in Jesus Christ. At home in an urban neighborhood of many faiths, we acknowledge that we are not alone on the path to understanding God. In worship, study, and fellowship, we celebrate our Presbyterian roots and find joy in our diversity. We strive for the grace to love one another as we seek a deeper understanding of life in the Spirit, working for justice and serving as stewards of God's wondrous creation.

Sixth Is a More Light Church: A network of people seeking and affirming the full participation of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer people of faith in the life, ministry and witness of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

Inclusive Language: Words matter. Jesus Christ, the living Word, reached out to all people to bring them into God's fold. The kingdom of God includes all people; therefore our language should reflect the inclusivity and equality among the people of God. To that end, when possible, we seek to eliminate the inherent bias of the English language toward the masculine gender without altering passages that reflect the historical situation of ancient patriarchal culture, out of which the Bible originated.



The Chamber Orchestra of Pittsburgh will host the return of the Joy Ike for two performances: Saturday, December 3, 7:30pm at Rodef Shalom and Sunday, December 4, 3:00pm at Sixth Presbyterian.

A highly gifted pianist as well as a composer, Ike will perform from her repertoire that has been featured on NPR, which celebrated her as "a truly compelling" performer. The program will also include Edvard Grieg's *Holberg Suite* and George Gershwin's *Lullaby for Strings*.

Ike's recent work includes a project to spread the joy of Mr. Rogers's "Won't You Be My Neighbor" as well as the reflective composition "Wearing Love." "Wearing Love is my response to 2020," says Ike. "In the blackhole of identity politics, social media wars, and our country's polarizing responses to racial injustice, this song is a response and a challenge to come up higher and do better, to wear love better than we wear our pride, or our political affiliations."

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LAMP Statement on Club Q (11/22/22)

We are heartbroken to hear of the shooting at Club Q in Colorado Springs.

Club Q is a place which should have been safe - made by and for queer folks, to go out, have fun, and relax. But minutes before midnight, before the clock turned to national Transgender Remembrance Day, that safety was violated.

We grieve with those who lost loved ones, those who survived with injuries in more than their bodies, and with the whole community who has to process yet another attack on their basic human rights.

There is no such thing as a mass shooting that makes sense.

Yet in the minds of some people, such violence can appear justified. And it is no secret why: we recognize the role of the Church in supporting, platforming, and perpetuating violence against queer folks. We condemn the Church's complicity in this horrific act. And we work and pray for the day when God's queer children flourish. Receiving only blessings and treatment that honors their inherent beauty, worth, and dignity.

Yet we have hope. Though all forms of church have at times been complicit, God never has. The core of our faith affirms that all queer individuals were created in the image of God, and do not have to change a thing to be sustained, supported, and wrapped in divine love.

In solidarity with the queer community, who is us, and our loved ones, we pray.
