There is an innocent season in our life, a garden of Eden, if you will, when the world is new and wonderful and there is so much to learn and explore and enjoy.



CLERK'S REPORT:

SESSION CORRESPONDENCE AND REFERRALS:

OMNIBUS MOTION:

There were no motions pulled for discussion. Ruling Elder Tom Juring moved that the entire Omnibus Motion be approved. The motion passed unanimously.

- Motion to approve the minutes of the Session Stated Meeting, January 25.
- Motion to approve the Congregational Meeting minutes, January 29.
- Motion to approve Sunday, April 23, as Earth Care Sunday.
- Motion to approve Adult Lenten study, "Blessing the Lent We Actually Have," and the "Teach What You Know" events.
- CE Committee motion to approve a story walk to be held during the Sunday school hour on Easter Sunday using the children's book "Twas the morning of Easter."
- CE Committee motion to approve collaboration with East Liberty Presbyterian Church for various children's and youth events and programming including VBS for June 2023 and middle school mission trip in July. Jenny Newman will work with East Liberty staff member Sarah Hackett on these and any future events/programs.
- CE Committee motion to approves a Confirmation Class for 2023 with interested students (7th grade and older) meeting with Jenny Newman April-October. The students will be presented to Session for membership approval at the September session meeting and be confirmed during the church service on Oct. 1.

FINANCES:

- Ruling Elder Frank Davoli presented the January financials. He pointed out that as it was the first month of the year, trends were not predictable.
 - Negative numbers on PNC account are due to timing of transfers

- Balancing of per capita has created an apparent income deficit
- Elder Davoli and Treasurer Erik Fogt will work to note more specific details about committee
 expenditures, especially those that come from a committee's budget that are not requested by its chair.
 There should also be a better system for defining money in/money out for items such as poinsettia sales or
 Fellowship events.

EMERGENCY DISASTER AND RESPONSE PLAN:

Ruling Elder Mary Lang and Jenny Newman have been evaluating the current plan and will confer with Elder Juring, as chair of House Committee. Elder Lang will be doing walk-throughs in the church with the Ushers and other church leaders, understanding that the plan needs to be updated. Those doing the walk-through can refer to the floor plans and note where AEDs, pull fire alarms, and fire extinguishers are located, as well as review evacuation plans in case of security issues. In the meantime, funding/grant sources will be explored. Elder Lang is planning to have CPR/AED training for the Ushers as well.
