# From the Pastor: A New Season Is Upon Us!

### On October 1st...

We will celebrate World Communion Sunday! This is one of my favorite worship services, as we remember our connection with other Christians around the globe.

You might remember: World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church here in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930).

World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another.

### On October 8th...

Pastor Sarah will lead worship, and the Rev. Dr. Asa Lee, President of Pittsburgh Theological Seminary will be preaching. We are delighted to host him and hear a good word about theological education and how we can be partners together. For more information about Rev. Dr. Lee, see page two.

# October 8 Guest Preacher: Reverend Doctor Asa J. Lee

There The Rev. Dr. Asa Lee was born in Suffolk, England, and is the product of a loving home where his mother and grandmother instilled in him the values of pride and integrity that are guiding him through his life and ministry.

Since coming to Christ as a teenager, Dr. Lee has used the gifts that God has given him to be in service to the community and the body of Christ. Rev. Lee exercises his gifts as a educator of leadership, worship and theology. He has taught in public and private schools in Virginia and Maryland, and served in a leadership capacity in several churches in the Hampton Roads Area of Virginia. It was while serving as the Minister of Music at the Saint John Baptist Church in Columbia, Maryland that he accepted the call to pastoral ministry.

Rev. Dr. Lee currently serves as the President of Pittsburgh Theological Seminary in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He comes to the presidency after seven years of service as Wesley Theological Seminary as Vice President for Campus Administration and Associate Dean for Community Life. Dr. Lee is a dedicated theological educator and believes strongly in education as the vehicle for expanding one's view of the world. He has served on the faculty of Northern Virginia Community College and is often a guest lecturer at workshops and seminars dealing with Christianity in the 21st century; religious difference; and issues affecting church leadership.

Rev. Dr. Lee completed the Doctor of Ministry degree in Educational Leadership at the Virginia Theological Seminary after having earned his Master of Divinity degree cum Laude from Wesley Theological Seminary. He completed his Bachelor of Arts degree in Music, Magna cum Laude from Hampton University. Dr. Lee was licensed by the Faith Shepherd Baptist Church of Washington, DC, and ordained by the Mount Olive Baptist Church of Arlington, Virginia, where he served for ten years as the Assistant Pastor/Minister of Christian Education. He has held membership in several professional and social organizations, including the American Academy of Religion, the Religious Education Association, the Association of Leadership Educators, and is a Life Member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated.

Dr. Lee is married to the Reverend Chenda Lee, an Elder in Full Connection in the Virginia Annual Conference of United Methodist Church. Together they have four beautiful daughters, Akeemah (Pronounced: Ah-key-ma), Jaanaiya (Pronounced: Jahnye-yah), Cydah (Pronounced: Say-duh) and Camaini

(Pronounced: Kah-may-knee).

# SUP pickup at Sixth Church is Sunday, October 29

Our next Single-Use Plastic (SUP) pickup at church.is on October 29. Cliff and Nora Johnson will be there to collect your SUP. Please contact Cliff and Nora at crindj@gmail.com if you have questions.

### Here are some guidelines. We ask that you::

- 1. Wash all your SUP so that it's oil- and food-free.
- 2. Deliver your clean SUP in brown paper bags or cardboard boxes. Plastic bags are not recycled at Michael Brothers. (Recycle plastic bags at Giant Eagle stores.)
- 3. Deliver them during office hours the previous week if you can't bring them on that Sunday.
- 4. Write your name and what number plastic is in the container on each container you bring.
- 5. Leave your bags and boxes in the hallway near the parking lot door to make it easy for Cliff and Nora to collect.

### WHAT TO BRING:

- Numbered Single-Use Plastic (SUP), numbers 1 to 7, which means only plastic that has a number within the chasing arrows recycle symbol. No unnumbered and unknown SUP is acceptable.
- Please sort the numbered plastic into #1, #2, and #3-7 containers. #1 separately, #2 separately, # 3-7 all combined.
- Plastic bottle caps and lids are accepted only if they are numbered. Please put them into your container with the appropriate number.
- Metal caps and lids are accepted! Please put them in a separate labeled container.

**REMEMBER:** Don't bring items that can be recycled through the city's recycling program such as milk or detergent jugs.

# **Notes from the September Session Meeting**

(NB: notes from Session are pulled from yet-approved minutes)

### **CLERK'S REPORT**

- Worship attendance: 8/27, 41 (in-person), 51 (YouTube); 9/3, 35 (in-person), 57 (YouTube); 9/10, 76 (in-person), 45 (YouTube); 9/17, 73 (in-person), 66 (YouTube); 9/24, 84 (in-person), 38 (YouTube)
- Commissioner for Pittsburgh Presbytery meeting, September 28, 2023, at Crestfield, 10 am—no volunteers

### **SESSION CORRESPONDENCE:**

John Creasy of Garfield Community Farm sent a thank you card for the recent gifts to their program.

### **OMNIBUS MOTION:**

- A motion from the Deacons and a motion concerning employee benefits were pulled for further discussion to be included under the appropriate headings.
- Elder Peter Watt-Morse moved to approve the amended Agenda. The motion passed unanimously.
- Elder Peter Kaplan moved to approve the remainder of the Omnibus that had not been pulled for further discussion. The motion passed unanimously.
- Motion to approve the minutes of the Session Stated Meeting, August 23, 2023
- Motion to approve the minutes of the called Session Meeting, September 18, 2023, as amended.
- Motion to approve a Congregational Meeting for October 29, 2023 to dissolve Rev. Kolb's call and to approve the PNC.
- The Stewardship Committee requests that the Session approve the proposed goal for the 2024 Stewardship Campaign. The Stewardship Committee proposed the goal of \$366,700 for the 2024 Stewardship Campaign. This represents an increase of 1.50% over the \$361,275 in pledges we received during last years campaign.
- The Stewardship Committee requests that the November meeting of Session be held on Wednesday, November 15, 2023.
- Motion to approve 2024 staff benefits model (due to the Board of Pensions, October 6) Pulled/approved.
- Motion to approve Deacons' request for financial assistance for the amount of \$2,250 by the end of 2023.
   Pulled/tabled

### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:**

- **FINANCE:** Elder Watt-Morse reported.
  - Pledges still over budget
  - The 2024 budget will be determined after the Stewardship campaign is completed.
  - Elder Watt-Morse will ask for budget requests from Committee Chairs
  - While there has been a loss of pledging units, there have been new families attending/joining as well.
  - Agreement that there should be ongoing education for newer members about pledging.
  - Elder Watt-Morse noted that long-term disability for Rev. Kolb will be assumed by the Board of Pensions, not the church, which makes some funds available.
- **PERSONNEL:** Elder Barbara Parees reported.
  - Following discussion and clarification of the Employee Benefits plan, the motion to approve the staff benefits model was approved.
  - The Personnel Committee will be working to establish a Parental Leave Policy for staff.

• The Safety Task Force met on September 24 and will ultimately be sharing information that all church leaders should know. Jenny Newman and Elder Parees will be attending an all-day safety seminar, sponsored by the Presbytery, in November.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:** Minutes are included in the Session Packet.

- Church and Community Elder Tom Twiss noted that they are still accepting proposals for the Rainy-Day fund, which offers emergency or disaster funding. Proposals are due by October 1,
- Earth Care A productive meeting and will be sharing updated information as they are able.
- Gun Safety Elder Lori King shared that their network of churches is expanding.
- Stewardship—Elder Kaplan reported that their campaign plans are going well. Speakers and writers are in place. Will consider ways of incorporating information about pledging. Rev Robbins noted that information and education assistance is available from Ellie Johns Kelly, through Pittsburgh Presbytery.
- Worship—Elders Scott Bell and Joan Markert met with Rev Robbins to finalize plans for World Communion Sunday, October 1. Communion Servers volunteered for October 1.

**DEACONS CARE LIST:** Rev Robbins referenced list with summer updates.

# **DEACON MINUTES:** Referenced in packet.

• The Deacons' motion to approve their request for financial assistance was pulled for discussion. Following a discussion to clarify the request and consider possibilities as well as future consideration, the motion was tabled. It was noted several times that the Session supported the mission and that ways of funding should be explored further. Elder Kaplan made a formal statement that Session is supportive of the need for funding for the Hot Metal Meals and that a variety of funding options should be explored, so the motion made by the Deacons will be tabled until the October meeting. Session agreed unanimously.

### **PASTORAL REPORT:**

- Rev. Robbins will have necessary information to the Elders for the Session Retreat on October 7, 2023 by Wednesday, October 4.
- Rev. Robbins will be leaving town for vacation on October 9-16. Elder Bell will greet the guest minister and Rev. Susan Rothenberg will handle congregational needs that may arise.
- Harry Kirk, Building Administrator, will be having some minor surgery, so will be off for a short while. Members of the House Committee will manage any issues.
- Rev. Robbins made a request to move the October Session meeting to a different day. The majority are able to attend on Tuesday, October 24 at 7 p.m. and agreed to make the change.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

• Night Market: Elder Marcus Robinson chaired a meeting of those involved in the committees who will be represented at the Night Market which takes place from 6-10 p.m. on October 7. Sixth will set up at 5:30 with tables and activities available until 8:30. Gun Safety, More Light, Christian Ed, C & C, and possibly Earth Care committees will be involved as well as other volunteers and staff. G S will have a poster with statistics, C E has craft activities, and Elder Kaplan has created a summary of all we do to share. They are seeking ideas for encouraging Night Market attendees to make their way to the church steps.
