#### September 1 – Labor and Sabbath

#### Confirmation

We have a plan! Students 7<sup>th</sup> grade older interested in confirmation will begin meeting monthly in September, starting with Pittsburgh Presbytery's day-long confirmation retreat at Camp Crestfield on September 30. We will meet through and meet through March 2024 and confirmands will be received at the March session meeting and confirmed during the worship service on Sunday, April 7. This year we will be joining our friends at East Liberty Presbyterian Church for our weekly youth fellowship time. Beginning September 13, youth 6th through 12th grade will meet on Wednesday at ELPC for Club One Sixteen from 4:30 to 7 pm. Dinner is provided each week at 5 pm. Jenny Newman will partner with Sarah Hackett (ELPC Director of CE and Youth) in planning and leading the weekly sessions. ELCP is located at 116 S. Highland Ave. Students will enter the church at the Highland avenue entrance and meet in the second floor parlor.

We will also continue volunteering at Hot Metal Bridge's The Table monthly and other youth gatherings throughout the year. Please see the fall youth calendar for all the upcoming dates. Youth who will be service at Hot Metal and attending youth group at ELCP are required to complete our church's <u>Universal Permission</u> form, so we have updated contact and health information. # Earth Care SUP Challenge Recap

Have you ever thought about how much plastic you use and why? The Earth Care committee decided to focus and reflect on our single-use plastic use and devised an activity to get the congregation involved. Back in May we did a "minute for mission" about the project and explained that we have a table at the front of the sanctuary with both information about how to reduce personal single-use plastic use and tracking sheets where folks can record any actions they take to avoid this kind of plastic use.

The 50 challenge participants avoided purchasing plastic containers or using disposable plastic items over 800 times during a 3-month period. The assorted and colorful "fruit" sprouting from our tree art in the sanctuary are caps and lids, each representing 5 avoidances. By far the most popular activity was bringing reusable bags for grocery shopping and bringing a reusable travel cup or mug was next. Also common are purchasing loose produce or putting it in a reusable bag, buying foods in glass or cans, reusable lunch bags, and skipping the straw, dryer sheet, or plastic utensil.

One conundrum: Plastic reduction in our food purchases can be difficult, because grocery store shelves are lined with plastic containers and packaging, increasingly, but it has a high impact on both our health and the environment because of how much every household uses every day. Plastic reduction in personal care purchases is becoming easier, on the other hand, with manufacturers increasingly offering cardboard or tins for items like hair products and deodorants, but households don't tend to purchase these items in high volumes.



Shopping online expands options for personal care items that are packaged sustainably, but consumers may worry about the impact of all those shipments. In Pittsburgh we are lucky enough now to have a store on Murray Avenue, called The Refillery, where home cleaning, laundry and personal care items can be squirted and scooped into one's own refillable containers. Options for purchasing groceries remain more limited, with the bulk section of East End Food Co-Op and a few offerings at chain supermarkets. Changing the ingredients we cook with and the places we regularly food shop inperson can be challenging.

Some updates on what Earth Care is hosting for group recycling: 1) Plastic

that can no longer be recycled curbside, such as clamshells, cups, and tub shapes, in numbers 1-7 is being collected every few months and taken to Michael Bros. 2) Empty coffee bags (Becca Stallings from a nearby church is willing to keep taking them from us, but requests small donations to help defray the cost of shipping them) 3) household batteries separated by type and with damaged or leaking ones bagged separately. On salty and sweet snack bags we are reorganizing and planning because of a change in where we can drop them off, so please hold off on those. Information about all active collections and updates can be found in the church bulletins and we will try to remember to post on Friends of Sixth Facebook.

Approximately four-fifths of Allegheny County Jail residents have not yet been convicted of a crime. Yet they are all given mostly inedible food, often denied prescribed medicine or offered it at the wrong time, and forced to spend nights in conditions too uncomfortable for sleep. Since April 2020, 20 have died, more than twice the average per year for jails of similar size. Health care workers have supervisors without medical credentials who order them to violate best practices, putting their licensure at risk. 90 staff positions are vacant and employees are forced to work excessive overtime. Warden Harper will retire September 29. How can we assure conditions will improve under the next warden?
