

Earth Care News

Avoid (Black) Plastic-

Do you flip your pancakes with a black plastic spatula? Did your last food delivery come in black plastic containers? When you were enjoying a quick meal at a fast food restaurant, did you eat it with black utensils? When we look around, it seems that black plastic is all around us.

According to <u>Beyond Plastics</u>, "Black plastics [made from recycled legacy plastics] are more likely to contain unregulated amounts of toxic chemicals including heavy metals and flame retardants which can leach into food and pose a hazard to human health." Moreover, black plastic is often not recycled because the infrared light technology used to sort plastics at materials reclamation facilities cannot detect the color black. As a result, these black plastic items end up in landfills or incinerators instead.



Although the <u>initial study that revealed unhealthy levels of toxins in black plastics has since been corrected</u>, plastic should be avoided when touching food, especially for cooking. Heat can cause plastic to degrade and create the opportunity for microplastics and nanoplastics to be consumed.

The next Michael Brothers church pick to recycle plastic items will on **Sunday January 11** by Jan Myers-Newbury.


WRAP UP/CLOSING PRAYER:
