Stewardship Committee Update

THANK YOU, to everyone who has pledged for 2026!!

We mailed out 109 Stewardship Packets; our Stewardship Goal was \$373,635 with an ask of a 3.5% increase over what people pledged in 2025. We received 75 pledges worth \$350,513.50 which is 93.81% of our Stewardship Goal.

While we lost 11 pledging units, we gained one new pledging unit and three returning pledging units.

We hope that those who were not able to pledge in 2026 will still donate when they are able. There is still time to pledge for 2026 and we will always take a new pledge anytime during the year.

CLERK'S REPORT:

- Roll Review: Clerk, Kathi Robinson-Dassel, shared the list of those who were contacted concerning membership status and the current update.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

- Pastor Charissa shared monthly activities and ongoing projects in her written report. She had two requests for action, which were approved:
 - ◊ Approval for December 28th: Reception of Member by reaffirmation of faith - Amanda Zeglin, and Baptism of Rowan and Violet Zeglin
 - ◊ Congregational meeting - according to bylaws needs to be between last Sunday of January and second Sunday of Feb. Meeting will be held February 1, 2026

COMMITTEE & WORKING GROUPS:

- Finance: Pledges continue to be below budget. 2026 draft budget was presented.
- Personnel: Blessed with a wonderful staff. Christmas bonuses given.
- House: Snow removal going well. Power shovel purchased and used. Furnace work to be completed so sanctuary will be warmer.
- Stewardship: 2026 campaign wrapping up.
- Worship: Communion dates approved for 2026
- Engagement:
 - ◊ Planning to look at ways to encourage church attendance and ultimately membership of new people.
 - ◊ Provide information at college campuses about the church.
 - ◊ Young adults' network within church has had some positive interest.

DEACONS REPORT: Deacons had two requests for discussion.

- Budgeted stipend approved for Steel City Table meal preparation
- Approval for Deacons to investigate use of name tags for congregation

OLD/NEW BUSINESS: Erik Vogt agreed to another year as Treasurer and was approved unanimously.
